Celebrating Telangana's Educational Renaissance on State Formation Day

The Telangana Council of Higher Education (TGCHE) commemorated **Telangana State Formation Day** with great pride and patriotic fervor on 2nd June 2025 at its headquarters in Masab Tank, Hyderabad. The National Flag was ceremoniously unfurled by **Prof. V. Balakista Reddy**, Chairman, TGCHE, in the presence of Vice-Chairmen **Prof. Etikaala Purushotham**, **Prof. S.K. Mahmood**, Secretary **Prof. Sriram Venkatesh**, and the entire Council staff.

In his address, Prof. Reddy reflected on Telangana's transformative educational journey since its formation. "We are equipping our youth for global leadership, and today Telangana proudly hosts **41 dynamic universities and higher education institutions**," he remarked.

Prof. Reddy spotlighted the establishment of four new universities in the state post-formation, which represent the government's vision for inclusive and forward-looking education:

- Veera Naari Chakali Ilamma Women's University – championing women's empowerment through higher education
- Young India Skill University (YISU) – bridging academia and industry with job-oriented programs
- Earth Sciences University, Kothagudem – promoting sustainability and environmental innovation
- Sammakka Sarakka Central Tribal

University – focused on tribal inclusion and equitable development

He outlined several landmark initiatives spearheaded by TGCHE over the past year:

- **T-SAT Network partnership** to democratize digital learning across Telangana
- **NASSCOM collaboration** to introduce industry-aligned employability skills
- **MoU with IIT Madras** for setting up innovation hubs and research centres
- **Tie-up with BDMAI** to reduce skill shortages in the pharmaceutical industry

The Chairman also announced visionary reforms to produce future-ready graduates, including:

- A **curriculum overhaul** integrating AI, Machine Learning, and Cybersecurity
- **Skill-based credits** for AI tools, communication, and soft skills
- **Internship opportunities** in governance and public policy to build civic-minded graduates

TGCHE Chairman Champions AI-Driven Education at International Conference ICAISC-2025 -05.06.2025

The Chairman of the Telangana Council of Higher Education (TGCHE), Prof. V. Balakista Reddy, attended the **International Conference on Recent Advancements in Artificial Intelligence and Soft Computing (ICAISC-2025)** as the Chief Guest at **Methodist College of Engineering and Technology**, Hyderabad. The event brought together distinguished researchers, industry experts, academic leaders, and students to deliberate on the future of AI and Soft Computing.

In his address, Prof. Reddy emphasized that Artificial Intelligence (AI) and Soft Computing have transitioned from theoretical constructs to transformative tools impacting critical sectors such as **healthcare, agriculture, governance, and education**. He noted that Telangana is actively embracing this revolution, positioning itself as a frontrunner in AI innovation.

Highlighting government initiatives, he shared that **Telangana was the first state to declare the "Year of AI"**, launching the Telangana AI Mission (T-AIM) in collaboration with **NASSCOM**. This pioneering move aims to transform Hyderabad into a **global AI innovation hub**, with strategic focus on **mobility, e-governance, agriculture, and healthcare**.

Prof. Reddy further elaborated on the role of TGCHE in aligning with **UGC's new undergraduate education framework**, effective from the **2025-26 academic year**. The revised structure introduces **over 20 credits for skill-based and value-added courses**, emphasizing AI

tools, cybersecurity, soft skills, and practical applications to reduce academic stress and enhance employability.

He praised **Methodist College of Engineering and Technology** for its leadership in AI education, noting its **NAAC A+ accreditation**, **NBA-accredited UG programs**, and its commitment to excellence through specialized courses in **Artificial Intelligence and Machine Learning**.

The conference, ICAISC-2025, served as a vital platform for researchers and professionals to share innovations, collaborate on challenges, and forge academic-industry partnerships. Prof. Reddy encouraged participants to engage deeply, stating that **collaborative action among academia, industry, and government is key to unlocking AI's potential for societal transformation**.

ICAISC-2025 received an overwhelming response with over 1,800 contributors submitting 910 research papers from 200+ institutions across 18 Indian states, along with international submissions from USA, Ethiopia, and Malaysia. After a rigorous peer-review process, 377 papers were selected for publication in the **CREWE International Journal of Engineering and Technology (GIJET)**, published by **Grenze Scientific Society** and indexed in **SCOPUS**.

He concluded by commending Methodist College for organizing such a meaningful conference and reaffirmed TGCHE's commitment to fostering future-ready education.

On June 9, 2025, Prof. V. Balakista Reddy, Chairman of the Telangana Council of Higher Education (TGCHE), participated as a distinguished speaker at the **World Ocean Day** celebrations hosted by the **Indian National Centre for Ocean Information Services (INCOIS)**, Hyderabad. The theme of this year's observance, **"Sustaining What Sustains Us – Blue Economy and its Opportunities,"** underlined the critical need to protect and sustainably harness our planet's oceanic resources.

In his address, Prof. Reddy acknowledged the oceans' fundamental role in regulating the climate, supporting biodiversity, and sustaining livelihoods. He raised concern over mounting challenges such as overfishing, plastic pollution, and ocean acidification, noting the urgency for transformative action.

He highlighted **Blue Economy** as a forward-looking solution for integrating economic development with environmental preservation. Key sectors of opportunity he outlined include:

- **Sustainable Fisheries & Aquaculture** – to ensure food security and support coastal livelihoods
- **Marine Biotechnology** – offering innovation through ocean-based bioresources
- **Renewable Ocean Energy** – tapping into wave, tidal, and offshore wind energy
- **Marine Tourism & Coastal Development** – for responsible, eco-sensitive growth
- **Marine ICT & Seabed Exploration** – with strict regulatory frameworks and technological precision

Prof. Reddy emphasized that **higher education institutions** must play a pivotal role in advancing the

Blue Economy through:

- Interdisciplinary programs in marine sciences, climate resilience, environmental policy, and technology
- Student-led research in ocean health, pollution control, and sustainable resource use
- Collaborations with agencies like INCOIS to facilitate internships, data access, and joint research initiatives

Despite being a **landlocked state**, Telangana's higher education policies reflect a strong commitment to **environmental awareness, sustainability, and global engagement**. Prof. Reddy reaffirmed TGCHE's dedication to nurturing a generation of environmentally conscious, technically skilled youth who can contribute meaningfully to India's marine and ecological goals.

In conclusion, he called for a **collective recommitment** to building a resilient and inclusive ocean economy—one that respects nature, prioritizes community well-being, and is guided by science and sustainability.

In his keynote address, Prof. Reddy emphasized the increasing significance of **research-based teacher education**, especially in the evolving landscape shaped by digital transformation, shifting learner needs, and the drive for evidence-based practices.

He addressed a crucial concern highlighted in recent **academic audits and NAAC reports**:

- Over **60% of teacher educators** struggle with formulating research problems.
- Nearly **70% of postgraduate dissertations** lack methodological rigor and effective statistical application.

The workshop was praised for directly tackling these challenges by enhancing competencies in:

- **Quantitative and qualitative research methodologies**
- **Basic statistical tools and interpretation**
- **Effective dissertation writing and academic presentation**

Prof. Reddy shared several key initiatives under TGCHE to support quality enhancement in teacher education:

• Establishment of **Research Support Cells** in all

state universities with dedicated funding for **Action Research Projects**

• Development of a **statewide digital portal** offering open access to dissertations, research tools, and curated datasets for teacher educators and students

He urged participants to actively engage in the sessions and apply their learning to mentor future teachers, conduct meaningful research, and influence policy and practice at the grassroots level.

"Teacher educators are the academic architects of our next generation. Through your research and reflection, we can transform thousands of classrooms across Telangana," Prof. Reddy remarked, calling for a **culture of inquiry, collaboration, and educational innovation**.

He concluded by congratulating **Palamuru University** for hosting a timely and impactful workshop and extended best wishes to all participants and organizers for its successful execution.

TG CPGET-2025 Notification Released: Admissions Open for PG & Integrated Programmes Across Telangana Universities

The Notification for Telangana Common Post Graduate Entrance Tests (TG CPGET) – 2025 was officially released on June 13, 2025 at 3:30 PM, under the aegis of the Telangana Council of Higher Education (TGCHE). This common entrance is conducted for admission into Postgraduate and 5-Year Integrated Programmes offered by the following universities in the state:

- Osmania University
- Kakatiya University
- Satavahana University
- Telangana University
- Mahatma Gandhi University
- Palamuru University
- Veeranari Chakali Ilamma Women's University
- Jawaharlal Nehru Technological University, Hyderabad (JNTUH)

The notification release ceremony was graced by dignitaries including Prof. V. Balakista Reddy, Chairman, TGCHE; Prof. Kumar Molugaram, Vice-Chancellor, Osmania University; Prof. E. Purushotham and Prof. S.K. Mahamood, Vice Chairmen, TGCHE; Prof. Sriram Venkatesh, Secretary, TGCHE; Prof. U. Umesh Kumar, Vice-Chancellor, Satavahana University; Prof. Surya Dhananjay, Vice-Chancellor, Veeranari Chakali Ilamma Women's University; and Prof. I. Pandu Ranga Reddy, Convener, TG CPGET-2025, among other officials from Osmania University.

On this occasion, Prof. V. Balakista Reddy, Chairman, TGCHE, highlighted the efforts being made to ensure a seamless admission process. He shared that 46,742 seats are available this year across the universities. Reflecting on the 2024 admissions, he proudly noted that 74% of

the filled seats were secured by girl students, showcasing a positive trend in women's higher education.

Prof. Kumar Molugaram, Vice-Chancellor of Osmania University, acknowledged the institution's continued commitment to excellence in administering TG CPGET. He also emphasized Hyderabad's emerging status as a national education hub and mentioned the 20% National Integration Quota (NIQ) being offered to students from outside Telangana.

Prof. I. Pandu Ranga Reddy, Convener, TG CPGET-2025, outlined the logistical preparations being made across the state for smooth conduct of the entrance tests. He urged students to be prepared with valid income and EWS certificates, wherever applicable, to avoid admission delays. He further noted that admissions will follow the local and unreserved reservation policy as per G.O. MS No.15 dated 27/02/2025, and the reservation for Persons with Disabilities (PWD) has been enhanced from 3% to 5% this year.

DOST-2025 Phase-II Seat Allotment Successfully Completed; Phase-III Registration Underway

The Telangana Council of Higher Education (TGCHE) is pleased to announce the successful completion of Phase-II of DOST-2025 admissions. Prof. V. Balakista Reddy, Chairman, TGCHE and Convener, DOST, declared the statistics of Phase-II allotments and outlined the schedule for Phase-III.

Highlights of Phase-II Allotment:

- Total Registered Candidates: 35,952
 - Aadhaar Mobile OTP Authentication: 33,331
 - DOST App Authentication: 1,311
 - MeeSeva Biometric Authentication: 1,310
- Total Candidates Who Exercised Web Options: 46,883
- Total Allotted in Phase-II: 43,568 (Includes 6,077 betterment cases)
- Candidates Not Allotted Due to Limited Options: 3,315
- Candidates Allotted First Priority Seat: 30,973
- Candidates Allotted Second/Other Priorities: 12,595

Faculty-Wise Seat Allotment:

- Commerce: 13,900
- Physical Sciences: 11,277
- Life Sciences: 8,821

Key Instructions to Allotted Candidates:

1. **Seat Allotment Intimation:** Candidates will receive SMS notifications and can also check details via the DOST website or WhatsApp service.

2. **Online Self-Reporting:** Candidates allotted seats must reserve their seats through Online Self-Reporting between 13.06.2025 and 18.06.2025 by paying ₹500 or ₹1,000.

- Candidates allotted seats in Government Degree Colleges or University Colleges and eligible for ePASS (subject to verification) need not pay any fee.

3. **Betterment Candidates:** Students who receive new allotments based on revised options in Phase-II must report afresh, as previous Phase-I reporting becomes invalid.
4. **Non-Reporting Consequence:** Failure to self-report will lead to automatic cancellation of the allotment and registration.
5. **Sliding Option:** Students can still opt for a better seat in Phase-III after completing self-reporting in Phase-II.
6. **Final College Reporting:** Candidates must report to their allotted college between 24.06.2025 and 28.06.2025, after Phase-III, to confirm their admission.

Phase-III Schedule:

- Registrations & Web Options: 13.06.2025 to 19.06.2025
- Seat Allotment Date: 23.06.2025

Prof. V. Balakista Reddy expressed satisfaction over the smooth progress of the DOST-2025 admission process and appreciated the proactive role of all stakeholders, especially college principals, DOST Help Centres, and district coordinators. On June 14, 2025, Prof. V. Balakista Reddy, Chairman of the **Telangana Council of Higher Education (TGCHE)**, attended and delivered the keynote address at the **National Seminar on “The Working of 75 Years of the Indian Supreme Court – An Academic Revisit”**, jointly organized by MSS Law College and the **University College of Law, Osmania University**.

The **Telangana Council of Higher Education (TGCHE)** takes pride in fostering academic dialogue on pressing legal and constitutional issues. At a recent symposium addressing “**The Domestic Implementation of International Law in India: Constitutional Framework and the Role of the Supreme Court**,” Prof. V. Balakista Reddy, Chairman, TGCHE, highlighted India's evolving relationship with international legal norms and their integration into domestic governance.

I. Constitutional Framework: Enabling but Conditional

While the Indian Constitution does not mandate automatic incorporation of international treaties, it empowers Parliament under **Article 253** to enact laws implementing treaties—even on matters

within the State List.

- **Article 51 (Directive Principles):** Urges the State to foster respect for international law.
- **Article 253:** Authorizes Parliament to implement international agreements legislatively.
- **Article 246 & 248:** Define legislative competence across Union, State, and residuary domains.

These provisions create a flexible yet sovereign framework for international law to influence domestic policy through legislative and judicial interpretation.

II. Supreme Court as a Bridge Between Global Treaties and Indian Law

India's apex court has played a proactive role in harmonizing global legal obligations with constitutional rights. It has often used **international conventions** to interpret **Fundamental Rights**, especially in the absence of explicit domestic law.

Landmark Judgments:

1. Vishaka v. State of Rajasthan (1997)

- Invoked **CEDAW** to issue guidelines on sexual harassment at workplaces.

- Recognized international treaties as tools to interpret Articles 14, 15, 19, and 21.

2. PUCL v. Union of India (2005)

- Cited ICCPR to strengthen rights to privacy and dignity under Article 21.

3. Gramophone Co. v. Birendra Pandey (1984)

- Advocated aligning municipal law with global conventions where consistent.

4. NALSA v. Union of India (2014)

- Used international human rights standards to affirm the rights of transgender persons.

5. Azadi Bachao Andolan (2004)

- Validated DTAA's under Article 253, reinforcing legislative support for treaty implementation.

III. Striking the Balance: Sovereignty and International Commitments

The judiciary has emphasized **harmony, not hierarchy**, between domestic law and international obligations.

- **Jolly George Varghese v. Bank of Cochin (1980):** Asserted that international norms must yield to domestic law unless legislatively adopted.
- **T.N. Godavarman v. Union of India (2002):** Referred to global environmental treaties to reinforce national environmental governance.
- **G. Sundarrajan v. Union of India (2013):** Reaffirmed the expectation that India must comply with international environmental obligations in executive decision-making.

IV. A Roadmap for Academia: Role of Higher Education in Global Legal Integration

Prof. Reddy emphasized the pivotal role of universities and law schools in strengthening India's capacity to absorb and implement international law:

- **Curriculum:** Encourage integration of international treaties and comparative constitutional law.
- **Research:** Support studies on how international law influences fundamental rights in India.
- **Engagement:** Promote student involvement in moot courts, legal aid clinics, and model

UN programs that focus on treaty law and rights-based frameworks.

V. Conclusion: Transformative Constitutionalism in Action

India's approach is not one of blind compliance but **"transformative constitutionalism"**—a principle of reconciling international standards with domestic realities to advance justice, dignity, and liberty.

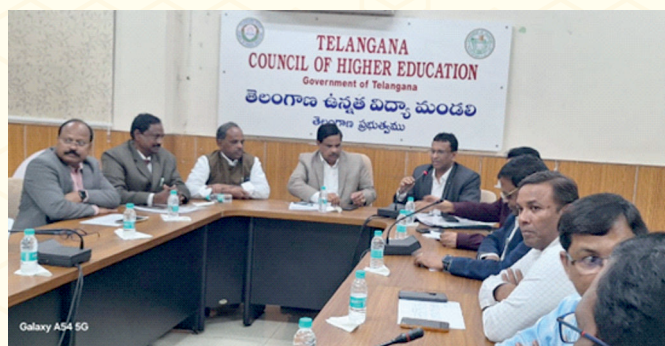
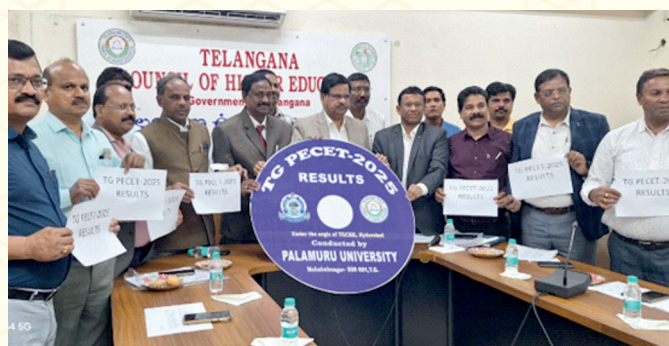

Applicants were allowed to make corrections in the application form on 25th May, and hall tickets were available for download from **26th May 2025**.

The Computer-Based Test (CBT) was conducted successfully on **1st June 2025 (Sunday)** in two sessions:

- **Session 1: 10:00 AM – 12:00 Noon**
- **Session 2: 2:00 PM – 4:00 PM**

Colleges to gain access to global skills, courses

All government and private colleges across Telangana will soon gain access to internationally co-developed online programmes and upskilling initiatives, following a new collaboration between the University of San Diego (USD) and the Telangana State Council of Higher Education (TSCHE). The partnership, announced after a high-level meeting at TSCHE headquarters in Masab Tank, will focus on faculty training, ethical AI, and aligning student skills with industry needs.

USD's Dean of Engineering, Dr Chell Roberts, clarified that the programmes will be open to every college in the state rather than a select few. While the courses will not be free, they will be offered at discounted rates designed to deliver strong value for both faculty and students seeking international-standard exposure without leaving India.

The delegation from USD, comprising senior officials from its law, engineering, and student services departments, met with TSCHE chairman Prof. V. Balakista Reddy and secretary Prof. Sriram Venkatesh to outline long-term cooperation. Proposed initiatives include joint master's programmes in AI, cybersecurity, and data science; structured faculty development; student exchanges; internships; hackathons; and technology-driven governance training. The partnership also envisions co-teaching models, enabling faculty from both sides to deliver a more applied, globally informed curriculum.

“India has brilliant minds, strong institutions, and a robust corporate sector. What's missing is a seamless ecosys-

tem that connects them. That's where we can help,” said Dr G.B. Singh, USD programme director and liaison for the India strategy.

Dr Roberts emphasised the need to move away from rote instruction, especially in engineering disciplines. “AI makes knowledge easy to access. The real challenge is teaching students how to apply that knowledge. That's where faculty training is critical.”

Prof. Reddy acknowledged the state's supply-demand mismatch in graduate output. “We're producing 1,000 computer engineers when the market needs only 100, while core branches like mechanical and civil are overlooked,” he said, noting efforts to rebalance through fellowships and targeted support for traditional streams.

The collaboration also includes plans for regulatory literacy workshops in emerging technologies. Both sides agreed that rapid advances in AI, blockchain, and cyber-crime outpace existing legal frameworks and called for training government officials and legal experts.

“Technologies are evolving faster than laws. That's a global challenge we can tackle together,” Prof. Reddy added.

TSCHE will act as the nodal agency to coordinate with public universities across Telangana and streamline implementation.

Successful Conduct and declaration of TG LAW CET & PGLCET-2025 by Osmania University on dt. 25.06.2025

The Telangana Law Common Entrance Test (TG LAW CET) and Postgraduate Law Common Entrance Test (TG PGLCET) for the academic year 2025-2026 were successfully conducted by Osmania University on 6th June 2025, under the aegis of the Telangana Council of Higher Education (TGCHE). These entrance exams facilitate admissions into 3-year and 5-year LL.B. programs and 2-year LL.M. courses offered by law colleges across Telangana.

TG LAW CET & PGLCET - 2025 was conducted on 06-06-2025. The analysis of the RESULT is as

follows:-

- The minimum qualifying marks for ranking in TGLAWCET (other than SC/ST candidates) is 35% of aggregate marks and the minimum qualifying marks for ranking in TGPGLCET (other than SC/ST candidates) is 25% of aggregate marks.
- However, there are no minimum qualifying marks for the candidates belonging to the category of Scheduled Castes (SC) and Scheduled Tribes (ST) for ranking.

The total number of the candidates registered for the tests [TG LAW CET (3-YDC), TG LAW CET (5-YDC) & TG PGL CET] was 57715. Out of them 45609 appeared in the tests and from them 30311 have qualified. On the whole 66.46% have qualified in both the TG LAW CET & TG PGL CET - 2025.

Course wise/ Analysis :

TG LAW CET was conducted for 3 Year/5 Year LL.B. Regular Courses and TG PGL CET was conducted for 2 Year LL.M. Courses.

Course wise & Gender wise:

TG LAW CET 3 YEARS (LL.B. Course): Out of 32118 appeared candidates, 21715 have qualified, and the qualified percentage is 67.61%. From among 21715 candidates, 15982 are males and 5731 are females and transgenders are 2. The qualified

percentage of males is 69.70%, females is 62.39% and transgenders is 100%.

TG LAW CET 5 YEARS (B.A./B.Com./B.B.A. LL.B. Course): Out of 9325 appeared candidates, 4833 have qualified, and the qualified percentage is 51.83%. From among 4833 candidates, 2678 are males and 2155 are females. The qualified percentage of males is 51.76% and females is 51.92%.

PGL CET (LL.M. Course): Out of 4166 appeared candidates, 3763 have qualified, and the qualified percentage is 90.33%. From among 3763 candidates, 2342 are males, 1420 are females and transgenders are 1. The qualified percentage of males is 89.70 %, females is 91.38 % and transgenders is 100%.

The event was broadcast live via TSAT on dt. 30.6.2025, marking a significant milestone in the state's higher education landscape. This pioneering digital outreach initiative aims to equip students for an academic journey centered on innovation, flexibility, and inclusivity."

The Chairman highlighted that the new UG curriculum marks a **paradigm shift from traditional rote learning to skill-based and multidisciplinary education**, aligned with UGC norms and international academic trends. Key features include **Four-Year UG Programmes**

(FYUGP) with Honours and Research tracks, flexible electives in cutting-edge fields like Artificial Intelligence, FinTech, Data Science, and Cybersecurity, and **mandatory internships** from the first year onward. The curriculum also embeds **communication and life skills training**, including revamped English modules across four semesters, and implements a **142-credit** cap to maintain academic depth without overburdening students.

Emphasizing the relevance of degree education, Prof. Reddy highlighted the relevance of all the streams of **BA/BBA/BCOM and BSC** by giving an elaborate account of the employment prospects and the new trends in their discipline – for example prospects for -

BBA students- Hospital/Retail/Airport management /Event/Digital Marketing/ Logistics and Supply Chain Management.

BSC students - Pharmacy / Biotechnology / Food industries / FMCG / Diagnostics / Data Science / Public health industry

BA students – NGOs / Media / Tourism department / Hospitality / Translation/ Interpreters / Public Policy.

BCOM students – Banking / Insurance / Finance / Entrepreneurship / Auditing Firms / Human Resources

To streamline academic planning and improve coordination across institutions, TGCHE has introduced a **Common Academic Calendar**, promoting uniformity in semester schedules, exam timelines, and academic events, while enhancing mobility and transparency.

Recognizing that true learning extends beyond the classroom, the Chairman stressed the importance of **year-round experiential learning**. 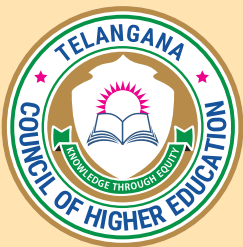
