The meeting brought together key stakeholders from planning, infrastructure, education, and governance sectors to deliberate on a forward-looking, inclusive development roadmap for the Hyderabad Metropolitan Region. Prof. Reddy emphasized the crucial role of **knowledge-based urban development**, highlighting the importance of integrating higher education and research

institutions into the region's long-term urban and economic vision.

He underscored the need to develop future-ready human capital, promote industry-academia collaboration, and enhance urban innovation ecosystems in sync with Hyderabad's transformation into a global hub for technology, life sciences, clean energy, and creative industries.

TGCHE reaffirmed its commitment to aligning academic planning with the metropolitan region's development aspirations under Vision 2047 and HMDA goals.

Prof. V. Balakista Reddy, Chairman, Telangana Council of Higher Education (TGCHE), attended and delivered the **Valedictory Address** at the prestigious National Conference on "Multidisciplinary Dialogue and Discourse in Arts and Social Sciences", held at the University College of Arts & Social Sciences, Osmania University, Hyderabad.

The two-day academic event served as a vibrant platform for faculty members, scholars, and students across India to reflect on the growing need for multidisciplinary approaches in higher education and research. The Chairman's presence and thoughtful address were among the highlights of the concluding session.

In his address, **Prof. Reddy commended Osmania University**—one of India's oldest and most respected institutions—for choosing a theme of contemporary relevance and for continuing its tradition of fostering liberal, inclusive, and socially engaged education. He praised the University College of Arts & Social Sciences for its pivotal role in shaping critical thought and promoting academic excellence in the humanities and social sciences.

Bridging Disciplines: A 21st Century Imperative

Prof. Reddy emphasized that in today's interconnected world, solutions to major global challenges—like climate change, public health, smart urbanisation, and inclusive governance—cannot come from a single domain. He noted that the boundaries between disciplines are increasingly dissolving, and this calls for a transformation in how higher education is designed and delivered.

Citing the World Economic Forum's Future of Jobs Report 2023 and UNESCO's Global Report on Higher Education (2022), he highlighted that top future skills—such as creativity, emotional intelligence, cultural awareness, and complex problem-solving—are deeply rooted in Arts and Social Sciences. These disciplines offer critical tools for understanding identities, communities, governance, and social change, making them indispensable in today's policymaking and innovation ecosystems.

Arts and Social Sciences: The Moral and Intellectual Bedrock

Calling these disciplines the "soul of education", Prof. Reddy elaborated on their role in building democratic, reflective, and humane societies. He observed that in a state as dynamic as Telangana and a country as diverse as India, the contributions of social sciences and humanities are crucial to shaping inclusive and sustainable development models.

He illustrated this through examples like:

- The Digital India and Swachh Bharat missions, which required not just technical infrastructure but also social awareness and behavioural change.
- Telangana's Palle Pragathi initiative, which stands as a case study in public policy, decentralisation, and community participation.

Vision 2047: Integrating Multidisciplinarity into Higher Education

As part of **TGCHE's Vision 2047**, Prof. Reddy reiterated the Council's commitment to reshaping higher education in Telangana to reflect the needs of a knowledge-driven and socially responsive society. He outlined several major initiatives:

- Promoting interdisciplinary UG and PG programmes that integrate traditional subjects with emerging fields (e.g., Political Science with Data Analytics, or Psychology with Digital Media),
- **Introducing open electives** that enable engineering, commerce, or science students



to explore literature, ethics, public policy, and social theory,

 Establishing Social Innovation Labs and offering field-based internships in governance, heritage preservation, and rural development.

He also spotlighted the TSAT Live UG Orientation Programme, a first-of-its-kind initiative launched by TGCHE to orient first-year students across Telangana. The programme featured eminent educators and public servants, encouraging students from all disciplines to develop social consciousness, cultural grounding, and global competence.

Message to Youth: Learn, Question, and Transform Society

In his closing remarks, Prof. Reddy addressed the student community directly. He urged them to become lifelong learners, to ask difficult questions, and to approach knowledge with

empathy, ethics, and purpose. The future, he noted, belongs to those who can connect ideas across disciplines, cultures, and technologies, and use education as a tool for societal transformation.

He concluded by thanking the organisers for their hospitality and initiative and congratulating all the participants for their academic contributions to the success of the conference

Chevening Fellowships and Scholarships: Promoting awareness and participation in prestigious UK-sponsored fellowships such as the Chevening programme, particularly in cuttingedge areas like science, innovation, and cybersecurity, in coordination with the Government of Telangana.

Off-Campus Centres of UK Universities: Exploring the legal and operational feasibility of establishing branch campuses of reputed UK institutions in Telangana to cater to the region's growing demand for international education.

During the interaction, Prof. Mahamood, Vice-Chairman-II, TGCHE highlighted the significance of capacity building and leadership development in Telangana's higher education ecosystem, while Prof. Sriram Venkatesh, Secretary, TGCHE emphasised the role of technology-driven education in shaping future-ready graduates.

Mahatma Gandhi University, Nalgonda, under the aegis of the Telangana Council of Higher Education (TGCHE), successfully conducted the Telangana Integrated Common Entrance Test (TG ICET-2025) for admission into MBA and MCA programmes for the academic year 2025-26 in the State of Telangana. **Results announced on dt.07.07.2025**

The TG ICET – 2025 was conducted smoothly across the State on **08th and 09th June 2025**, witnessing an encouraging participation and a high qualification rate.

Result Highlights:

• Total Registered Candidates: 71,746

• Total Appeared: 64,938

• Total Qualified: 58,985

Overall Qualification Rate: 90.83%

The minimum qualifying mark for ranking in TG ICET is 25% of aggregate marks, except for candidates belonging to Scheduled Castes (SC) and Scheduled Tribes (ST) categories, for whom no minimum qualifying marks are prescribed.

90.83% qualify in TG ICET-2025

MAHATMA Gandhi University (MGU) and the Telangana State Council of Higher Education (TGCHE) have announced the results for the Telangana Integrated Common Entrance Test (TG ICET-2025), with a total of 90.83 per cent of candidates qualified.

The results were announced by TGCHE Chairman, Prof V Balakista Reddy, TGCHE Vice-Chairmen I and II, and Professor Aluvala Ravi, the Convenor of TG ICET-2025, and senior

officials on Monday. The online entrance test was conducted, from June 8 to June 9 by MGU, Nalgonda, under the supervision of TSCHE. The test is for admission into MBA and MCA programs for the academic year 2025–26 in the State of Telangana. Out of a total of 71,746

Out of a total of 71,746 candidates registered, 64,938 appeared for the examination, and 58,985 candidates qualified. This resulted in a total pass percentage of 90,83%. A gender-wise analysis of the results show that out of the candidates who appeared for the test, 17146 were male, 34412 were

female, and one identified as transgender. Of those who qualified, 27,998 were male, 30,986 were female, and one

The minimum qualifying marks for ranking in TG ICET (excluding SC/ST candidates) are 25% of the aggregate marks. However, there are no minimum qualifying marks for candidates belonging to the Scheduled Castes (SC) and Scheduled Tribes (ST).

Prof. V. Balakista Reddy, Chairman, Telangana Council of Higher Education (TGCHE), delivered the opening remarks at the prestigious National Seminar on Empowering India's Research Future – Research for a Resilient, Self-Reliant, Viksit Bharat, underlining the critical role of research in shaping India's development trajectory towards 2047.

In his address, the Chairman emphasized that as India approaches the centenary of its independence, research must form the cornerstone of its progress. A truly Viksit Bharat, he noted, is one that invests in knowledge, fosters innovation over imitation, and applies research to enable inclusive and sustainable growth. While India is poised to become the 3rd largest economy by 2030, with Gross Expenditure on R&D (GERD) currently at 0.7% of GDP, bold initiatives like the proposed National Research Foundation (NRF) are vital to accelerate the transformation.

Highlighting Telangana's significant strides in higher education, he cited:

- A Gross Enrolment Ratio (GER) of 39.1%,
- 2nd highest college density in India (52

colleges per lakh population),

- 140 autonomous colleges, and
- 29 universities, with over 1.07 lakh engineering seats.

These indicators, he noted, reflect the State's readiness to become a hub for research and innovation.

The Chairman also outlined **TGCHE's strategic initiatives** to foster a dynamic and future-ready research ecosystem:

- Telangana Journal of Higher Education (TJHE): A peer-reviewed, multidisciplinary platform for impactful research.
- Curriculum Reforms: Adoption of UGC's Curriculum & Credit Framework from 2025–26, with over 20 credits allocated to future skills like AI, Data Science, and Emerging Technologies.
- **Digital Research Access:** Expanding research accessibility via INFLIBNET collaboration and promotion of One Nation One Subscription.

- Inclusive Research Culture: Drafting research ethics policies and supporting participation from marginalized and firstgeneration researchers.
- **International Collaborations:** Establishing global linkages, including partnerships with institutions like the University of San Diego.

He concluded by presenting **five strategic priorities** for a resilient research future:

- 1. Decentralising research capacity through regional hubs.
- 2. Linking research with real-world societal outcomes.

- 3. Enhancing funding and mentorship for young researchers.
- 4. Promoting interdisciplinary approaches across disciplines.
- 5. Fostering a national research culture from the undergraduate level.

Prof. Reddy reiterated TGCHE's commitment to aligning Telangana's educational and research policies with the vision of Atma Nirbhar Bharat and Viksit Bharat @2047. He called on all stakeholders to transform this vision into reality through meaningful collaboration, bold policy initiatives, and a shared resolve to position India as a global research leader.

- Establishment of **STEM clubs and leadership workshops** in women's colleges.



Mudhole MLA Seeks TGCHE Chairman's Intervention in Addressing Faculty Shortage at Government Degree College, Mudhole



Hyderabad, 19 July 2025 –Shri Pawar Ram Rao Patil, Hon'ble MLA from Mudhole (10) Assembly Constituency and member of the Public Accounts Committee, Telangana Legislative Assembly, met with Prof. V. that approves recruitment of guest lecturers. He pointed out that the current G.O. does not cover Mudhole, thus excluding the college from both teaching and non-teaching staff appointments.

Shri Patil emphasized that this matter is of **urgent importance**, given that **Mudhole is a socially and economically backward region**, where the majority of students come from marginalized backgrounds. He stated that **state-run institutions like the Government Degree College play a pivotal role in providing accessible and affordable higher education**, and the current staffing gaps directly impact the academic future of the students.

Prof. V. Balakista Reddy, Chairman, TGCHE, acknowledged the concerns raised and assured Shri Pawar Ram Rao Patil that he will take up the matter with the Government of Telangana and explore appropriate action to address the shortage of faculty at the earlie

The budget allocation for 2025–26 for each university was announced, with major institutions such as Osmania University and Veernari Chakali Ilamma Women's University receiving ₹100 crores each, while other universities like KU, MGU, and BRAOU received substantial grants for academic upliftment.

In the concluding session, Prof. V. Balakista Reddy, Chairman, TGCHE, lauded the efforts of all universities and reiterated the Council's commitment to quality enhancement, interdisciplinary learning, and global academic collaborations. He urged the institutions to prioritize NAAC reaccreditation, meaningful research, and student-centric innovation to propel Telangana into a leading hub for higher education in India.

The university plans to introduce four Undergraduate (UG) and four

Postgraduate (PG) programs in the fields of:

- Geology
- Geophysics
- Geochemistry
- Environmental Science

These programs are aligned with UGC, AICTE, and NEP 2020 guidelines and reflect a multidisciplinary, research-oriented, and industry-aligned approach to Earth Sciences education. They are designed to address both regional priorities—such as Telangana's mineral-rich landscape and ecological challenges—and national needs in energy security, sustainable development, and environmental governance.

Key Highlights of the Delegation Visit

During the visit, the delegation undertook a comprehensive review of the university's infrastructure, academic roadmap, and faculty recruitment plans. The officials interacted with the project execution teams and reviewed proposed laboratory spaces, field research plans, and digital learning infrastructure.

Chairman, TGCHE, Prof. V. Balakista Reddy, emphasized the university's potential to become a pivotal institution in India's higher education ecosystem by nurturing geoscientists, climate specialists, and environmental analysts equipped with 21st-century skills. He called for the integration of AI, Machine Learning, and Remote

Sensing into the curriculum and highlighted the importance of **industry-academia collaboration**, field-based training, and global research partnerships.

In his remarks, Hon'ble Minister Shri Tummala Nageshwar Rao expressed satisfaction over the rapid development and reiterated the Government's commitment to make Kothagudem a hub of scientific learning and innovation. He assured continued administrative and financial support to expedite the rollout of academic and research activities.

Prof. V. Balakista Reddy, Chairman, Telangana Council of Higher Education (TGCHE), delivered the **keynote address** at the **QS I-GAUGE India Academic Forum 2025**, an event that brought together thought leaders, academic administrators, and global ranking experts to discuss the transformation of Indian higher education under the theme "Catalysing Change: Reforms and Readiness in Indian Education."

In his address, the Chairman emphasized that India's educational reforms, particularly under the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020, are among the most comprehensive in its independent history. He described NEP not as a policy document but a "clarion call for a new imagination of learning", one rooted in Indian ethos and aligned with global ambitions.

Prof. Reddy underscored NEP's focus on flexibility, multilingualism, experiential learning, and vocational training, noting that true reform means **bridging urban-rural divides**, removing **socio-economic barriers**, and equipping students for life, not just employment. He highlighted the

proposed **Higher Education Commission of India (HECI)** as a unified body that would regulate, accredit, fund, and set academic standards—replacing UGC, AICTE, and NCTE.

Telangana's Proactive Role in Implementing NEP 2020

The Chairman elaborated on the transformative reforms spearheaded by **TGCHE** in **Telangana** in response to NEP 2020:

- Implementation of Four-Year Undergraduate Programs (FYUP) across all universities and autonomous colleges
- Integration of skill-based and vocational education in key growth sectors such as BFSI, construction, and safety management
- Reforms in the Common Entrance Tests
 (CETs) through digitalisation, mock
 counselling, and transparent admission
 systems
- Promotion of faculty development, experiential learning, and stronger industryacademia collaboration

He concluded by reminding academic leaders—Vice-Chancellors, Deans, Principals, and Directors—that they are not merely implementers but **catalysts and visionaries**. He urged collective responsibility in making education systems **responsive**, **inclusive**, **and future-focused**.

TGCHE's Mission


Prof. Reddy reaffirmed the mission of the Telangana State Council of Higher Education:

Telangana Council of Higher Education Introduces Contemporary Legal Subjects in Undergraduate Law Curriculum



Hyderabad, 26th July 2025: In response to rapidly evolving global legal landscapes and the growing influence of technology in law and society, the Telangana Council of Higher Education (TGCHE) has undertaken a landmark curriculum revision aimed at modernizing undergraduate legal education in the state.

A meeting held at the TGCHE premises on 26th July 2025, chaired by Prof. Balakista Reddy, Chairman, TGCHE, brought together eminent legal educators including Prof. Subramanya, Dean, CMR University and former Legal Counsellor to the Kingdom of Bahrain, and Ms. Bangaru Laxmi Jasti, Assistant Professor, Mahindra University, to deliberate on curriculum enhancement in legal education.

Earlier, TGCHE had constituted a subject expert committee comprising Prof. G.B. Reddy and Prof. Vijaya Laxmi from the Department of Law, Osmania University, and Prof. A.V.N. Rao, Former Dean, ICFAI Law School, to review and revise the undergraduate law syllabi. The committee conducted several meetings and consultations with stakeholders and submitted comprehensive recommendations for the introduction of new, academically relevant courses.

Building upon the expert committee's inputs and broader academic discussions, the Council resolved to incorporate ten new subjects into the undergraduate law curriculum, with a view to aligning legal education in Telangana with emerging global trends, national priorities, and the evolving regulatory framework of the Bar Council of India (BCI).

Following detailed academic discussions and expert consultations, TGCHE resolved to incorporate the

following ten new subjects into the undergraduate law curriculum:

Cyber Laws and Cybersecurity, Emerging Technologies and Law, Law on Transportation, Law on Security and Strategic Studies, Media and Technology Law, Juvenile Justice Act and POCSO, Consumer Protection Act, International Trade Law, Bankruptcy and Insolvency Law, Competition Law

These additions address vital and fast-growing areas in legal practice, such as cybersecurity, artificial intelligence, e-commerce, insolvency, national security, and cross-border trade. Courts across India increasingly rely on legal professionals to provide expert opinions in these domains, highlighting the urgent need to equip law graduates with specialized, applied knowledge.

Speaking on the occasion, Prof. Balakista Reddy emphasized, "Legal education must remain responsive to the complexities of the modern world. The proposed curricular enhancements are not just timely—they are necessary to prepare a generation of legal professionals who can operate effectively in both national and international legal arenas."

The decision reflects the BCI's broader mandate under the Legal Education Rules, 2008 (Schedule II), which calls for periodic curriculum updates to reflect contemporary issues and challenges. The inclusion of these subjects, though marginally increasing overall credits, is academically justified and aligned with global best practices in legal education.

This reform marks a significant step towards building a future-ready legal education system in Telangana—one that is interdisciplinary, forward-looking, and rooted in real-world legal developments.

TGCHE calls for English with local context and accessibility through technology



TGCHE held a meeting on Dt.28.07.2025 at TGCHE to revise the undergraduate curriculum in General English, beginning with the Academic Year 2025–26. The meeting brought together representatives from English departments—Chairpersons of Boards of Studies and Heads of Department—from the public universities of Telangana.

TGCHE introduced a bold step aimed at reaching students from all parts of society across the state. Prof. V. Balakista Reddy, Chairman of TGCHE, called for uniformity, fairness, and inclusion in the syllabus across all universities in Telangana.

These measures seek to Focus on skill-based learning to build practical knowledge that supports employment. Emphasis will be placed on English used in real life situations—such as at work, in communication, and in digital and creative settings. It also seeks to encourage a Balance between flexibility and depth—the syllabus follows the "light but tight" idea, i.e., less content, but with clear concepts and useful skills. The other features are the following—

- English with a local flavour The reading content will include elements of Telangana's history and culture. This change aims to connect with local experiences and support meaningful engagement.
- 2. Revision of the English Language syllabus The content will follow NEP 2020 guidelines. English skills will be linked with other subjects, as part of the NEP's broad academic approach.
- Learning materials prepared by TGCHE Several steps are being taken to support the new syllabus:
 - a. **PDF-based reading material** A clear and standard digital resource is in progress.

Students will be able to access it at no cost.

- b. **Teacher audio clippings** Recordings of lessons and language elements are being prepared. These will help faculty in teaching pronunciation and student in learning pronunciation of English
- c. Teacher orientation sessions via T-SAT TGCHE, working with the T-SAT Network, will offer sessions for English faculty. These will include guidance on teaching methods, digital content, and ways to assess student progress.
- 4. **Focus on essential skills** The curriculum will centre on listening, speaking, reading, and writing. These skills will form the basis of the student learning experience.
- 5. Education at the doorstep About 200 pages of reading material will be shared in PDF format. Audio files will explain the new syllabus and will be made available on the Council's website. Students will receive these materials at no cost.
- 6. **Integrated approach** All areas of language learning—listening, speaking, reading, writing, grammar, vocabulary—will be brought together. A model question paper will also be included.
- 7. **Distinct features of the material** Lessons carefully prepared by experienced faculty will be used. Teaching will follow a clear, step-by-step method, similar to solving problems with ordered instructions.
- 8. **Purpose of the meeting** The gathering aimed to pass on information and collect views from subject experts.

In the reference 2nd read above, the Telangana Admissions and Fee Regulatory Committee(TAFRC) has stated that the proposals for fee fixation submitted to TAFRC by the Private Unaided Professional Colleges for the block period of 2025-28 are at variance with the parameters, terms and conditions of the relevant Supreme Court and High Court, and TAFRC has recommended to appoint a Committee of Officers to examine the parameters for fee fixation and suggest revised parameters for fee fixation in respect of Private Unaided Professional Colleges, duly studying the process being followed in other State and keeping in view the relevant Supreme Court and High Court orders.

2. Government, after careful examination of the matter, hereby constitute a Committee of Officers to examine and propose appropriate parameters for fee fixation in respect of Private Unaided Professional Institutions. The Committee shall explore and identify relevant indicators and benchmarks to be considered for determining fee structures, keeping in view the practices adopted by other States, the relevant judgments of the Hon'ble Supreme Court and High Courts and other pertinent factors impacting the cost of education. The recommendations of the Committee shall be aimed at enabling the Telangana Admission and Fee Regulatory Committee (TAFRC) to discharge its regulatory mandate effectively in due course:
