TGCHE releases Press about Mega Placement Drive

The Telangana Council of Higher Education (TGCHE), as part of its **Internship and Skill Development Initiatives**, is convening a **Mega Campus Placement Drive, 2025**, in collaboration with the Bulk Drug Manufacturers Association of India (BDMAI) at **Palamuru University** only for **male candidates** on 11th October 2025 from **10:00 AM onwards**

The TGCHE and the BDMAI have signed a landmark Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) on 8th February 2025 to bridge the skill gap between academia and the pharmaceutical industry and develop industry-relevant curriculum and training programs. The MoU focuses on equipping students with practical knowledge and competencies in key areas such as pharma manufacturing, research and development, quality control, and environmental management.

The BDMAI, an apex industry body representing nearly 500 bulk drug and pharmaceutical manufacturing companies across India in Telangana, Andhra Pradesh, Gujarat, Maharashtra, Himachal Pradesh, and Tamil Nadu has come forward to provide employment opportunities to the youth through the signed MoU.

The drive is open only for male candidates from the batches 2025, 2024, 2023, 2022 & 2021, possessing qualifications such as M.Sc. Chemistry, M.Sc. (5-Year Integrated) Chemistry, Microbiology, M. Pharm, B. Pharm, B.Tech (Mechanical, Electrical, Chemical, Instrumentation), B.Sc. Chemistry, Intermediate, and ITI.

The candidates will have an opportunity to be placed in reputed companies for various positions such as **QC, QA, Chemist, Machine Operators, and other technical roles**.

Prof. Reddy elaborated on the practical aspects of RTI implementation, highlighting the duties of

public authorities to provide clear, accurate, and timely information. He urged all stakeholders—particularly those in higher education institutions—to uphold the spirit of openness and responsiveness in public service.

By fostering such initiatives, **TGCHE** continues to champion a transformative agenda—one that not only enhances governance standards but also empowers the academic community to contribute meaningfully to the ideals of participatory democracy and public trust.

TGCHE, requests Youth of Telangana to Participate in World Skill Competition 2026

The TGCHE is actively partnering with the Department of Employment and Training, Government of Telangana, to disseminate comprehensive information about these skill competitions and requests all youth of Telangana to participate in the **World Skill Competition – 2026**, the Olympics of Skills, scheduled to be held in **Shanghai, China, in September 2026**.

The **Department of Employment and Training, Government of Telangana** is the nodal agency at the state level for conducting **State Skill Competitions**, while the **Ministry of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship, Government of India**, is the nodal agency at the national level for **India Skill Competitions**.

Winners of the **State Skill Competition** will represent Telangana in the **India Skill Competition**, and national winners will represent **India** at the **World Skill Competition 2026 in Shanghai**.

The competitions cover **63 skill categories**, including Cyber Security, Web Technologies, Additive Manufacturing, IT Network Systems Administration, Electronics, Brick Laying,

Electrical Installations, Cooking, Bakery, Landscape Gardening, and more.

Eligibility criteria:

- **General Skills:** Born on or after January 2004
- **Advanced Skills:** Born on or after January 2001

Participation is only through registration on the **Skill India Digital Portal:**

The last date for registration is 15th October 2025.

TGCHE Conducts Online Awareness Programme on Right to Information (RTI)

In pursuance of the Government's U.O. Note and as part of the State-wide observance of **RTI Week 2025 (5th–12th October 2025)**, the **Telangana Council of Higher Education (TGCHE)** organized an **Online Awareness Programme on the Right to Information (RTI)** on **7th October 2025 (Tuesday) at 11:30 a.m.**

The programme was addressed by **Prof. V. Balakista Reddy, Chairman, TGCHE**, and was attended by **Prof. E. Purushotham, Vice-Chairman-I, TGCHE**, along with **Vice-Chancellors, Registrars, Faculty Members and RTI Officers** of State Universities and their affiliated colleges across Telangana.

In his address, **Prof. V. Balakista Reddy** highlighted the significance of the **Right to Information Act, 2005** as a cornerstone of democratic governance, transparency, and accountability. He emphasized that RTI not only empowers citizens to seek information but also strengthens institutions by promoting openness and integrity in administrative processes.

During his detailed presentation, Prof. Reddy elaborated on several key themes including:

1. **Introduction:** The Right to Information Act, 2005, stands as one of the most powerful democratic reforms in India, ensuring transparency, accountability, and citizen empowerment. It enables every individual to seek information from public authorities, fostering trust and participatory governance.
2. **Importance of RTI Week & Awareness Campaigns:** RTI Week (5th–12th October) is observed across Telangana to promote awareness among citizens and officials. These campaigns aim to enhance understanding of the RTI Act and strengthen transparency, participation, and good governance.
3. **Origins of the Right to Information:** The global RTI movement began in Sweden in 1766 and spread to over 130 countries worldwide. These laws share a common goal—to promote openness, prevent corruption, and ensure accountability in public administration.

4. **International Human Rights and the Right to Information:** RTI is recognized globally as a fundamental human right under the UN Declaration of Human Rights (1948) and the ICCPR (1966), affirming that access to information is essential for free expression and democratic participation.
5. **Historical Background in India :** India's RTI movement grew from grassroots struggles such as the MKSS campaign in Rajasthan, demanding transparency in public spending. These citizen efforts led to the passage of the RTI Act, 2005, replacing the weaker Freedom of Information Act, 2002.
6. **Indian Constitution and Right to Information :** The RTI principle is rooted in Articles 19(1)(a) and 21 of the Constitution, which guarantee freedom of speech and the right to life. Judicial interpretations have affirmed that the “right to know” is fundamental to democracy.
7. **Judicial Pronouncements & Jurisprudence:** Landmark cases like *Raj Narain (1975)*, *S.P. Gupta (1982)*, and *PUCL (2004)* recognized RTI as part of the fundamental right to freedom of expression. Courts continue to strengthen the balance between transparency and privacy.
8. **Overview of the RTI Act, 2005:** The Act provides a practical framework for citizens to access information, asserting that “disclosure is the rule, secrecy the exception.” All government-funded universities and institutions fall under its purview.
9. **Objective of the Act:** To promote transparency and accountability in all public authorities, empower citizens, and build a participatory and corruption-free governance system.
10. **Main Principles of the Act:** The Act is guided by principles of maximum disclosure, proactive publication, open government, public interest, and timely

access—ensuring that citizens can easily obtain information.

11. **Scheme of the Act:** Comprising six chapters, the Act outlines citizens' rights, obligations of authorities, structures of Information Commissions, appeals, and penalties—ensuring institutional responsibility at all levels.
12. **What to Disclose and What Not to Disclose:** While administrative and public-interest information should be freely available, exemptions apply to matters of national security, personal data, and ongoing investigations to maintain a responsible balance.
13. **Drawbacks, Challenges, and Misuses:** Delays in responses, lack of awareness, and threats to activists hinder effective implementation. Strengthening RTI mechanisms and protecting users remain key priorities.
14. **Proposals for Improvement in the Digital Age:** Digital technology should be leveraged to simplify filing, tracking, and responding to RTI queries. Secure e-platforms, policy reforms, and public participation can enhance accessibility and efficiency.
15. **Achievements (2005–2025):** Over the past two decades, RTI has empowered citizens,

exposed corruption, and strengthened accountability. Around six million applications are filed annually, demonstrating its deep public impact.

16. **Limitations and Challenges:** Despite notable success, challenges persist—such as backlogs, limited awareness, and balancing transparency with privacy. Institutional strengthening and continuous training are needed.
17. **RTI in the Digital Age and Its Impact :** RTI has entered the digital era with online portals and e-governance tools enabling faster access. However, data protection laws like the Digital Personal Data Protection Act, 2023, require a careful balance between openness and privacy.

Prof. Reddy invited participants to share suggestions and best practices to compile a common booklet or handbook for universities and colleges on effectively handling RTI queries.

At the conclusion of the programme, the Secretary, TGCHE, proposed a Vote of Thanks, expressing gratitude to all participants and urging universities to conduct similar awareness programmes during RTI Week (5th –12th October 2025). He further requested all institutions to submit a brief report with photographs of their RTI activities to the Telangana Information Commission and TGCHE by 15th October 2025.



Chairman, TGCHE has attended an online lecture of Trade, Law, IPRs Treaties & Technology for Space LAW

Prof. (Dr.) V. Balakista Reddy, Chairman, Telangana Council of Higher Education (TGCHE), attended an online lecture on “Trade, Law, IPRs Treaties & Technology for Space Law” on 8th October 2025. The session brought together leading academicians, legal scholars, and policy experts to deliberate on the complex interrelationship between international trade regimes, intellectual property rights, technological innovation, and space law.

The lecture highlighted the growing importance of space as a strategic and economic frontier, emphasizing the need for coherent legal and institutional frameworks to govern activities in outer space. Discussions revolved around key international treaties such as the Outer Space Treaty (1967) and recent developments concerning commercial space ventures, satellite communication, and technology transfer.

In his address, Prof. Reddy underlined the critical role of law and policy in promoting transparency,

innovation, and global cooperation in the peaceful use of outer space. He stressed that as India's space sector expands rapidly under public-private collaboration, there is a pressing need to build national expertise in space governance, IPR protection, and technology regulation.

Drawing from his academic background as a distinguished scholar in international law and air and space law, Prof. Reddy advocated for introducing interdisciplinary courses and research initiatives in higher education institutions to prepare the next generation of legal professionals, technologists, and policymakers in this emerging domain.

The lecture served as a valuable platform for knowledge exchange and capacity-building, reflecting India's commitment to contributing to global space governance through education, research, and responsible innovation.

Chairman, TGCHE at the CII EDU Summit 2025

The Chairman, Telangana Council of Higher Education (TGCHE), **Prof. V. Balakista Reddy**, addressed the **EDU Summit 2025**, convened by the **Confederation of Indian Industry (CII)**, on the theme *“Future of Work: Skills, Mindset, Impact”* on **16.10.2025**.

The summit brought together leaders from **academia, industry, and government** to deliberate on how education systems must evolve to meet the demands of a rapidly changing world. Prof. Reddy's keynote address captured the spirit of transformation sweeping across higher education and its alignment with the future of work in India and beyond.

Citing international studies, he pointed out that **nearly 50 percent of existing jobs will require reskilling or upskilling by 2030**, underscoring the urgent need to rethink both the what and the how of learning. The emerging workforce, he said, must be equipped not only with technical skills but also with the **ability to think critically, collaborate effectively, and innovate ethically**.

“Our task is not merely to produce graduates, but to nurture **future-ready professionals** who can thrive in an environment of constant change,” he remarked.

He emphasized that higher education institutions must become **ecosystems of innovation and curiosity**, preparing students to navigate an unpredictable global economy with confidence and creativity.

2. Telangana's Vision: From Education to Employability

Under the visionary leadership of the Government of Telangana, the Telangana Council of Higher Education has launched a **comprehensive mission to align education with employability**, driven by **innovation, inclusivity, and industry collaboration**.

Prof. Reddy outlined several flagship initiatives of TGCHE designed to bridge the gap between classroom learning and workplace relevance:

- **Skill Development and Internships:** In collaboration with industry bodies such as CII, TASK, and BDMAI, TGCHE is promoting campus placement drives, structured internship programmes, and **apprenticeship-based learning** models across universities and colleges.
- **Curriculum Reform:** The Council has initiated the integration of **Artificial Intelligence, Data Science, Renewable Energy, Digital Commerce, and Entrepreneurship** into higher education curricula, ensuring that students acquire future-oriented competencies.

He called for cultivating a **growth mindset** that celebrates learning from failure and adapting to change. He further highlighted the need to replace **rote learning** with **experiential education**, encouraging the establishment of **innovation labs, incubation centres, and community-based projects** across campuses.

Education, he emphasized, must foster:

- **Critical and design thinking**
- **Empathy and emotional intelligence**
- **Adaptability to technology and diversity**

Such an approach, he said, will not only enhance employability but also instil a sense of social responsibility among students – shaping them into creative, compassionate, and ethical citizens.

4. The Impact We Seek

Prof. Reddy underlined that the success of education cannot be measured merely by the number of degrees awarded, but by the **lives transformed and opportunities created**.

He reiterated that higher education must ensure **equitable access to quality learning and employable skills** for every student – whether studying in a metropolitan university or a rural degree college.

Education, he said, must become a **vehicle of inclusion, sustainability, and human dignity** – empowering every learner to participate meaningfully in the economy and society.

5. The Way Forward: Collaborative Innovation

Concluding his address, Prof. Reddy emphasized that the **future of work is not a solitary journey**; it demands the **synergy of Government, Academia, and Industry**.

He invited CII and other industry partners to work closely with TGCHE in the following areas:

- **Establishing Industry-Integrated Learning Hubs** in state universities to strengthen the academia-industry interface.
- **Designing co-branded skill certifications** aligned with emerging economic sectors such as clean energy, digital finance, and advanced manufacturing.
- **Launching Faculty Immersion Programmes** to help educators stay abreast of technological and industrial innovations.

“Together, we can make Telangana a leader in education-employment integration – a model for the rest of India,” he asserted.

Chairman, TGCHE at the International Conference on Global Tourism: New Avenues for Sustainable Development

The Chairman, Telangana Council of Higher Education (TGCHE), Prof. V. Balakista Reddy, attended the International Conference on “Global Tourism: New Avenues for Sustainable Development” organized by the Department of Commerce, Osmania University, Hyderabad, as the Guest of Honour on 16.10.2025.

The conference brought together **academicians, tourism professionals, policy experts, and students** to discuss the transformative potential of sustainable tourism in the global and Indian context. In his address, Prof. Reddy reflected on the evolving tourism landscape, the opportunities it offers for inclusive development, and the pivotal role of higher education in shaping a responsible and resilient tourism economy.

1. The Changing Landscape of Global Tourism

Prof. Reddy began by highlighting that **tourism is one of the world's largest economic sectors**, contributing nearly **10% of global GDP** and supporting one **in every ten jobs** across the world. Despite the disruption caused by the COVID-19 pandemic, the global tourism industry has demonstrated exceptional resilience and revival.

According to the **UN World Tourism Organization (UNWTO)**, international tourist arrivals reached **1.3 billion in 2023**, marking a **33% increase over 2022**, with global tourism receipts amounting to around **US\$ 1.5 trillion**, nearing pre-pandemic levels.

India too has witnessed a strong resurgence:

- **18.89 million international tourist arrivals** in 2023 – surpassing the pre-pandemic figure of 17.9 million.
- Over **2.5 billion domestic tourist visits**, reflecting a **45% growth** compared to 2022.
- The travel and tourism sector's contribution to India's GDP stood at **₹19.13 trillion**, providing employment to over **43 million people**.

“These numbers reaffirm that tourism is not just an economic driver but also a catalyst for social inclusion, cultural exchange, and regional development,” Prof. Reddy observed.

He also cautioned that **uncontrolled tourism can strain ecosystems, erode heritage, and disrupt local livelihoods**, calling for a shift towards responsible and sustainable growth.

2. Telangana's Emerging Tourism Landscape

Prof. Reddy spotlighted **Telangana's remarkable potential** as a tourism destination – a state endowed with a unique blend of **heritage, nature, culture, and innovation**.

He referred to the **Telangana Tourism Policy 2025–2030**, which envisions transforming the state into one of India's most sought-after tourism destinations, focusing on **heritage, culture, eco-tourism, wellness, and rural tourism**.

Key highlights of the policy include:

- Attracting **₹15,000 crore in new tourism investments** within five years;
- Creating **three lakh new jobs** in tourism-linked sectors;
- Developing **27 Special Tourism Areas (STAs)** with integrated master plans;
- Promoting **public-private partnerships** and eco-tourism circuits connecting natural and cultural assets;
- Positioning Telangana among the top **five Indian states** for tourist arrivals.

From **Hyderabad's heritage monuments and culinary traditions** to **Warangal's Kakatiya legacy, Ramagundam's forest trails, and Nagarjunasagar's eco-parks**, the state's diversity offers immense scope for sustainable tourism. He also commended recent initiatives such as the **Gadhpur Jungle Safari** and new **eco-tourism parks** being developed across forest zones, which merge conservation with livelihood opportunities.

3. The Road Ahead: Education, Skills, and Policy Synergy

As Chairman of TGCHE, Prof. Reddy underscored the **central role of higher education** in nurturing a generation of professionals who understand and implement sustainability in tourism.

He outlined five strategic directions:

- **Curriculum Reform:** Universities must integrate **tourism management, environmental studies, heritage conservation, and entrepreneurship** into interdisciplinary programmes. “Students must learn not only how to promote tourism, but how to preserve what makes it valuable,” he said.
- **Skill Development:** TGCHE is working with **CII, TASK, and industry partners** to promote **internships, apprenticeships, and entrepreneurship training**. He emphasized that tourism offers diverse careers – from **hospitality and digital marketing to eco-guiding and craft-based enterprises**.
- **Community Engagement:** Prof. Reddy encouraged institutions to adopt **villages or heritage sites as living laboratories**, where students can implement sustainable tourism models and work with local artisans.
- **Research and Innovation:** He proposed the establishment of **Tourism Research Centres and State Tourism Observatories** to monitor trends, assess impacts, and use AI-based tools for real-time analysis.
- **Collaborations and Partnerships:** He called for **stronger government-academia-industry partnerships** to promote smart tourism, green infrastructure, and heritage conservation. He also emphasized collaboration under **UNWTO, G20 Tourism Track, and Global South-South Partnerships** for knowledge sharing.

4. Vision for Sustainable Impact

Looking to the future, Prof. Reddy envisioned **Telangana's tourism landscape in 2035** – one that is inclusive, sustainable, and community-driven. He described a future where:

- Tourists explore **rural eco-villages and tribal hamlets** alongside iconic urban attractions;
- **Local youth** lead eco-treks, craft tours, and wellness retreats;
- **Heritage monuments** are managed through community participation;
- **Renewable energy** powers hotels, transport, and tourism facilities;
- Tourism becomes a pillar of both **state GDP and local well-being**, without compromising ecological balance.

“This vision is achievable if we combine education, policy, innovation, and empathy,” he emphasized, quoting Mahatma Gandhi: “The future depends on what we do in the present.”

5. Conclusion: Tourism with Purpose

In conclusion, Prof. Reddy reaffirmed that **tourism is not just about destinations – it is about people, purpose, and preservation**. He described tourism as a bridge between **the local and the global, nature and economy, past and future** – and urged educators, policymakers, and entrepreneurs to ensure that this bridge remains strong, inclusive, and sustainable.

Commending the **Department of Commerce, Osmania University**, for organizing the international conference, he lauded the academic fraternity for advancing dialogue on sustainable tourism and inspiring young scholars to contribute to global development goals.

“Let us make global tourism a true force for sustainability – where every journey enriches not just the traveller, but also the planet and its people.”

Japanese-Style Physical Fitness and Digital Innovation: Strengthening the Future of Holistic Education in Telangana

Organized as a collaborative initiative between experts in **sports science, physical education, and digital innovation**, the event aimed to introduce the Japanese approach to fitness assessment and explore how technology can transform physical literacy among youth.

In his inspiring keynote address, the Chairman commended the organizers for their visionary efforts in integrating **fitness, technology, and education** — a combination he described as “essential for nurturing disciplined, confident, and future-ready citizens.”

Japanese Philosophy of Fitness and Discipline

The Chairman highlighted that Japan's fitness culture is rooted not merely in physical strength, but in **discipline, precision, and mindfulness** — values deeply embedded in Japanese society. He explained that the **Japanese-style physical fitness testing** is a comprehensive framework that measures **flexibility, coordination, posture, stamina, and mental focus**, often supported by digital analytics and real-time tracking.

He observed that this system reflects a holistic philosophy:

“A healthy body and a disciplined mind together form the foundation of a strong and resilient nation.”

Drawing inspiration from this model, the Chairman emphasized the need to cultivate

similar values among students in Telangana — encouraging them to see fitness not as a competitive pursuit, but as a lifelong practice of balance, endurance, and well-being.

Integrating Fitness and Education: A Vision under NEP 2020

Reiterating the spirit of the **National Education Policy (NEP) 2020**, the Chairman said that **sports, fitness, and well-being are integral components of holistic education**. He stated that learning must go beyond classrooms to nurture qualities such as **resilience, leadership, teamwork, and self-confidence**.

He further noted that by adopting **scientific fitness testing and digital applications**, higher education institutions can promote a culture of **self-assessment and accountability** among students. “Education without physical and emotional well-being remains incomplete,” he remarked, calling on institutions to integrate sports science and health analytics into their academic ecosystem.

Technology and the Future of Health Monitoring

The Chairman highlighted how digital technologies are reshaping health and lifestyle worldwide. The increasing use of **wearable devices, AI-driven analytics, and digital fitness platforms** has opened new possibilities for **personalized health monitoring and preventive care**.

He proposed that incorporating such technologies in Telangana's colleges and universities can:

- Promote a **data-driven culture** of physical fitness;
- Encourage students to take **ownership of their health**;



- Enable institutions to **design targeted wellness and sports programmes**; and
- Foster a spirit of **continuous improvement and accountability**.

He described this convergence of **Japanese discipline, Indian innovation, and digital intelligence** as a promising model for shaping the future of higher education and youth development.

The Chairman reaffirmed the Government of Telangana's unwavering commitment to the **development of youth, sports, and physical literacy**. In his concluding remarks, the Chairman urged the academic community to look beyond physical testing and embrace the **Japanese model as a philosophy of holistic living** – one that harmonizes **body, mind, and technology**.



• Providing paid internships and placement support through Thirulabs' partnerships with over 100 cyber security companies across India and overseas.

• Building a community of ethical cyber security professionals capable of addressing global digital threats.

India's Growing Cybersecurity Landscape

The proposal cites national data highlighting that the Indian Cyber Security Market, valued at USD 4.04 billion in 2024, is projected to reach USD 17.75 billion by 2033, reflecting a compound annual growth rate (CAGR) of 15.6%.

- Software toolkits and study materials curated by industry experts.
- Weekly mentoring and interactive doubt-clearing sessions.
- Workshops, guest lectures, and technical fests to promote collaborative learning.

Each participating institution will form a core student team guided by trained faculty mentors, supported by Thirulabs' technical staff.

Continued from P1 Prof Reddy said his visit to IIT-Madras further opened avenues for joint incubation centres, research parks, and integration with national platforms like National Programme on Technology Enhanced Learning (NPTEL) and SWAYAM Plus (Swayam's upgraded, skill-focused platform that provides industry-tailored courses for professional development and employability). "These partnerships are not symbolic—they are building a robust pipeline of industry-ready graduates and positioning Telangana as a leader in academia-industry innovation," he said. In alignment with the state's long-term development blueprint, "Telangana Rising 2047", TGCHE has introduced several structural reforms. These include the enhancement of faculty superannuation age from 60 to 65, ensuring retention of experienced academic leadership; structured funding mechanisms for degree colleges to improve infrastructure and research capabilities; and the establishment of Research and Innovation Clusters (RICs) to foster collaboration between universities and state industries. Prof. Reddy emphasized that these steps reflect the government's commitment to inclusive, research-driven growth and ensure that higher education institutions become active partners in Telangana's economic and technological advancement.
